# Relationships, sex and sexual health

Relationships can be exciting and fun, but there are lots of things you need to think about if you and your partner decide you both want to have a sexual relationship. You **both** need to think about contraception, pregnancy and protecting against sexually transmitted infections.

Being prepared doesn't have to take the fun out of the relationship and it doesn't mean either of you are planning to sleep around. It means you are thinking sensibly about your future and about your health.

Always remember to talk through things with your partner and listen to what they want too. If they don't feel ready or don't want to have sex, don't put pressure on them – it's important that you're both happy with whatever happens in your relationship. The age of consent in the UK is 16, which means it is legal to have sex once you are 16 years old. Remember though, whatever your age, you shouldn't have sex until you feel ready or unless you're sure that you want to.

## **Emergency contraception**

If you are any age and require emergency contraception, call in at **any** of the walk-in clinics, Monday to Friday, 7am-7pm. If you are over 25 and require contraception, it is best to make an appointment with your GP. However, if you have run out of pills and cannot get an appointment with your GP in time, the clinics will issue you with three month's supply.

#### > Free condoms and advice

All clinics will provide free condoms. Condoms, pregnancy testing and advice are also available from ARC (daytimes only).
